CAMP EQUIPMENT LIST

THIS IS A GUIDE ONLY:

Complete Uniform (travel to camp wearing this)

Coat-hanger

Sleeping Bag

Roll mat/blanket

Pviamas

Waterproofs (top and bottoms)

Warm coat

Warm Sweater (s) or Sweatshirts

Outdoor trousers (at least one non-denim)

Spare clothing – enough for a weekend in a wood!

Shirts / T-shirts

Shorts (being optimistic)

Bathing / shower towel

Walking Boots

Hiking Socks

Wellington boots (Optional)

Gloves

Woolly Hat

Underclothes & Socks

Training Shoes

Personal Washing Requirements

Hand towel

Personal First Aid Kit

Torch & spare batteries

Tea Towel x 1

Knife, fork & spoon

Plate, bowl & mug

Sun cream

FOOTWEAR – training shoes are not adequate as the only footwear on a scout camp.

Even if there is no rain, a dewy morning will quickly saturate trainers and they will not dry out in a weekend.

Sturdy footwear is essential – you would not like to be in wet shoes for 36+ hours.

Scouts wishing to use axes and saws must wear hiking boots!

Medication – Must be handed in to a leader on arrival, with written instructions

Spending Money (suggested max £3).

Mobile phones should not be taken to camp. A pay-phone is available on the site.

The leaders cannot accept responsibility for loss or damage to personal equipment. Scout camps are hostile to personal stereos, pagers and other delicate equipment. We strongly suggest that these and similar items are left at home.

Items should be packed in plastic bags within a rucksack or bag. All main bags will be transported in a trailer which is NOT waterproof!!
